Peter called the meeting to order at 19:01 PDT in the Eureka Municipal Auditorium (Muni) Meeting Room @ $406\ 11^{th}$ St. (11th and E).

Introductions were made and the log book was passed around. 18 members attended.

EMCOMM Report: Peter gave information about EmComm events as follows:

- At the next EmComm meeting on May 17th we'll meet at the Eureka Muni to discuss amateur radio's roll in fire response, looking first at issues from the Santa Rosa fires. A fire-based scenario exercise is tentatively scheduled for Saturday July 21st.
- Peter will invite Fred Flores give a talk about the Incident Command System at a future EmComm meeting.

Old Business: Marcy and Jaye are working on a list of our club founding members.

- Jim told us the City of Eureka will only allow the club to have 3 keys to the Muni building.
- All trailer keys are in the possession of Steve Isherwood **KK6MPV** and Carl Eggleston **KM6LIQ.**
- Carl is continuing to improve our HARC website.

New Business:

- Lynn Sturgis **KM6OQS** donated a Samsung laptop computer to the club. Thank you Lynn!
- Peter reminded us, as a club, we are not "Disaster Service Workers" nor will we ever be such. With that said we heard from Marcy about our liability insurance for our participation in public events and other insurance coverages through ARRL. Marcy will talk with our agent and ask for a written insurance summary we can all understand in time for our next meeting
- Peter wonders if it is time for HARC to join FWRA as a Chapter under FWRA bylaws. This would give HARC equal status with RARC and SHARC on the FWRA Board and equal share of fiscal responsibilities for the FWRA. Peter will explore the possibilities and report later. (A side note from Don C.; it seems SHARC has all but disbanded.)
- Don Nelson **WA6NBG** told us the county HAM station needs to buy a replacement computer for digital use.
- Dan is looking into replacement military mast guy stakes and equipment to make them easier and safer to first install and later pull out of the ground.

Former "Coast to Coast AM" Radio Show Host Art Bell, W6OBB, SK

Former "Coast to Coast AM" and "Dreamland" radio host Art Bell, W6OBB, of Pahrump, Nevada, died on Friday, April 13, at his home, the Nye County Sheriff's Office announced. He was 72. A KSNV news report indicated that Bell's family was with him when he died. The Sheriff's Office said an autopsy would be performed.

Bell's long-running radio show trafficked in conspiracy theories, the paranormal, and "dark matter." Ham radio came up too, from time to time. In early 2004, Bell aired an extensive live interview with

then-ARRL President Jim Haynie, W5JBP (SK).



"Coast to Coast AM" was syndicated nationwide in the early morning hours and, at its peak, was said to have reached 50 million listeners. Bell produced the show from his own studio in the High Desert of Nevada. Often, after his show was over, he would get together on 75 meters with a group of friends.

Bell retired from "Coast to Coast AM" in the early 2000s, although he had served as a guest host as recently as 2010. He briefly returned to the air with "Art Bell's Dark Matter," which lasted several weeks on the SiriusXM satellite network, but he

subsequently got involved with another radio program, "Midnight in the Desert," streamed via the Internet. He quit that show in 2015, however, citing "security concerns" at his home.

Bell was the author of the books *The Art of Talk*, *The Quickening*, and *The Coming Global Superstorm*. Read more. -- *Thanks to KSNV and* International Business Times

SILENT KEY

RICHARD JOSEPH DAGER He is gone from among us. We will miss his face. His ears can no longer

hear the thunder. But he knows now what we desire to know, beyond the thunder. Richard Joseph Dager was born July 9, 1923 and he died April 24, 2018 in St. Joseph's Hospital due to sudden heart failure. From his Canton, Ohio birth until his 94th birthday in Fortuna, Richard remained humble and never appreciated a lot of attention, the general 'pomp-and-



circumstance' of ceremony, or being in the limelight. Being modest, he often refused praise or special acknowledgment. He was a Flying Tiger fighter pilot with Chennault's US Army Air Force in WWII and, although he received honors, seldom spoke of those experiences. After the war, he became a Republic Steel mill foreman. Married to Thelma Faye Drake for over 60 years, they had two children (Diann Christensen and Susan Dager), four grandchildren (Christian Griffith, Keith Dager, Irene Dager and Anna Dager) and a great granddaughter (Kai Marley-Jane), born a month before his passing. Throughout his life, evenings were filled with ham radio code and EchoLink chatter. He loved mechanics, cars, planes, boats, photography, metal and woodwork, radio, computer and technical pursuits. Being with friends, family, and friends-of-family were ever his greatest joy. His pride was in being known as the loyal and dedicated provider that he was. Expecting to see him in his chair is like expecting the sun to rise, and we will miss his steady and consistent hand.

Informal Amateur Radio Nets Being Maintained in Wake of Volcanic Eruptions in Hawaii

Two informal informational nets remain open on the island of Hawaii ("The Big Island") in the wake of recent and ongoing volcanic eruptions and seismic activity, Pacific Section Emergency Coordinator Clement Jung, KH7HO, reports. No formal traffic has been passed, but frequencies are being monitored.

"All normal communications, such as cell, landline phones, internet, and public safety, are operational," Jung told ARRL. Fissures associated with the Kilauea volcano on The Big Island began erupting on May 3, spewing lava and venting high levels of sulfur dioxide.

An Amateur Radio net is in operation on 7.088 MHz (SSB), and the Voluntary Organizations Active in Disaster (VOAD) 146.720 MHz repeater (100 Hz tone) on Mauna Kea was

activated after Hawaii's governor issued an emergency declaration. A federal disaster declaration has been approved.

The Hawaiian Volcano Observatory reports active venting of lava and hazardous fumes continues, with no end in sight. The Hawaii Volcanoes National Park closed after roads and trails were damaged. The Observatory this week increased the Aviation Color Code to RED, due to increased ash emission.

FEMA reports some 360 evacuees are staying in emergency shelters. Some 2,000 residents have been evacuated in all. "Twenty fissure vents have formed in and around the Leilani estates subdivision," the agency said in its May 17 report. "Air quality in the southeast area of Lanipuna Gardens has been rated 'condition red' (immediate danger to health) for high levels of sulfur dioxide. Volcanic-tectonic seismicity continues."

The US Geodetic Survey has warned that new lava outbreaks could happen "at any time," as well as "more energetic ash emissions."
