TOWER TRAINING

Hams convened Saturday June 9 near the boat landing under the Bay bridge to test and erect the HARC military portable tower. As some of you may not know, our small HARC trailer had been broken into; of all the things to steal, a tool box containing most of our tower couplers and stainless steal guy supports had been taken. Dan kb6de spent

much time and effort hunting down and buying replacement parts for the tower earlier this year, and by gosh, he had ALL the parts we needed to fully assemble and erect the tower. GREAT WORK DAN!

Dan and Jaye also decided to study the field manual for the tower. We learned

several easy steps to quickly prepare and assemble the tower. With many helpers, we preloaded all the guy lines, then labeled them for

quick set up. We also found a simpler way to set stakes. All these steps make it that much easier for set up and dismantle. So this year, we will have far fewer problems getting the tower and antennas ready.

Peter called the meeting to order at 19:03 PDT in the Eureka Municipal Auditorium (Muni) Meeting Room @ $406 \, 11^{\text{th}}$ St. (11th and E).

Introductions were made and the log book was passed around. 25 members attended.

Health and Welfare:

Don Nelson **WA6NBG** said he had heard on the net the previous day that Jack **KM6TE** was out of the hospital, with his daughter, and doing alright.

Secretary Report:

The May 1st minutes were reviewed. Lynn Sturgis **KM6OQS** motioned to accept and Joyce Isherwood **KJ0YCE** seconded. The minutes were accepted unanimously.

Treasurer's Report:

Marcy reported our May End Balance was \$2287.83. Howard Lang **KB6NN** motioned to accept the report and Jim seconded. All votes were AYE.

EMCOMM Report:

- Peter gave information about EmComm events as follows:
- The next EmComm meeting will be ON AIR on June 15th we'll meet on the FWRA frequencies to discuss amateur radio's roll in fire response, looking first at issues from the Santa Rosa fires. A fire-based scenario exercise is tentatively scheduled for Saturday July 21st.

Old Business:

- Peter is continuing to investigate trailer storage locations.
- Lynn donated a Samsung laptop computer to the club. Thank you Lynn!
- Peter reminded us, as a club, we are not "Disaster Service Workers" nor will we ever be such. With that said we heard from Marcy about our liability insurance for our participation in public events and other insurance coverages through ARRL. Marcy will talk with our agent and ask for a written insurance summary we can all understand in time for our next meeting
- Peter wonders if it is time for HARC to join FWRA as a Chapter under FWRA bylaws. This would give HARC equal status with RARC and SHARC on the FWRA Board and equal share of fiscal responsibilities for the FWRA. Peter will explore the possibilities and report later. (A side note from Don C.; it seems SHARC has all but disbanded.)
- Don N. told us the county HAM station needs to buy a replacement computer for digital use.
- Dan is looking into replacement military mast guy stakes and equipment to make them easier and safer to first install and later pull out of the ground.

New Business:

- Carl Eggleston KM6LIQ is continuing to work on the trailer electrical Bill of Materials and club website, including a new mail list and potential online payment option for dues.
- Peter spoke with Bill Hillendahl **KH6GJV**, Pacific ARRL Section Manager, and reported that HARC's ARRL insurance is predominantly to cover lawsuits from public events such as Field Day.
- Howard had drafted scenarios of club events and insurance coverage, and is working with Marcy to have it reviewed by HARC's insurance agent.
- Don N. told us the county has purchased a desktop computer for digital use at the HAM station. He and Howard tested the computer and the one functional HF wire antenna, which works OK. FL message and FL amp were used. The OES HAM station is digital capable. There is a tuner available, but it is not currently in use.
- Peter reports that Dan Eaton KB6DE is continuing to work on replacement military mast guy stakes

and equipment to make them easier and safer to first install and later pull out of the ground in preparation for Field Day 2018.

- Dick Van Hoose WB6HII is in the market for a tower. HARC will sell 3 sections for \$50 each. Motioned by Don N. seconded by Don C. All voted Aye.

Past Event Report:

- May 6th: Ave. of the Giants Marathon (run) was well attended. We used the EmComm trailer.
- May 8th: Second Tuesday Meeting: Carl will taught us about grounding.

 May 19th: Tour of the Unknown Coast, 100 mile bicycle ride. No injuries reported, we used the EmComm trailer.
- May 26th to May 29th: Kinetic Sculpture Race Peter had the highest number of volunteers that he
 could remember. Peter also wanted to note that the Net Control Operator directs information and
 communication. Net Control is not necessarily a bank of even information.
- Anthony recounted a tale of the U.S.S. Festiva, a Kinetic Sculpture that was quite entertaining and surprisingly did not need US Coast Guard assistance.
